What is Direction for Bedfordshire?

Direction for Bedfordshire is a service originally commissioned by the Police and Crime Commissioner. It was developed to provide a 'one stop shop' approach for professionals and service users to get guidance on how to access the myriad of services available across the county to help rehabilitate and make a positive contribution to our communities.

As a charity, YouTurn Futures has grown this service by sourcing additional funding from 2 members of staff in 2019, to 5 now in 2022.

We have also broadened the reach of Direction to also include delivering Conditional Cautions and Community Resolution interventions for Bedfordshire Police and Supported Pathways for Central Bedfordshire and Luton to help young people 16-25 years of age to be supported away from a life of gangs and crime.

This month we caught up with Poets In who a Creative Mental Health charity; they had some good news that they are going to be working with the East of England Probation to offer their programme to service users. They provide a range of bespoke and tailored mental health services that focus on utilising creativity at the core. The specialised programme uses various creative mediums to reduce the symptoms and impact of mental illness, whilst improving the mental wellbeing of participants.

This month we were invited to attend the Liaison & Diversion Team meeting, the Reconnect team was also present. We were able to share with them what we do and hear about the services they provide. This was a great networking opportunity for us, and we have already been able to joint work with them to support a service user together. The Liaison and Diversion Team work at Luton and Kempston police custody and Bedfordshire Magistrates' Courts. They offer screening and triage services to vulnerable adults who are going through the criminal justice process. There positive outcomes can include liaison with and referrals to other support agencies and diversion away from the criminal justice system, e.g. Under the Mental Health Act. The Reconnect Service is for people coming out of prison (HMP Bedford and HMP Peterborough). It is a new pilot project and is part of the National project to improve health outcomes for people released from prison. We look forward to continuing to work together with them and develop links for all.

We are pleased to announce that we have 2 new members of staff, we know you will join us in welcoming Teri and Stephanie to the Youturn Team, Stephanie will be assisting the Charity with Performance Analysis and Teri is our HR and Business Manager. They will both be a great addition to our team as we hope to expand and develop.

We are working on plans to offer a safe space for our clients to meet with us and offer some drop-in sessions. Please get in contact if you would like to collaborate to set something up or like us to come to speak to your own clients or offer a drop in for them. We look forward to hearing from you.

Case Studies

We have been working with Vincent for a while and he is keen to find work. He had a meeting with the Job Centre who referred him for an SIA course to try and get into the security industry, however with the type of conviction and lengthy sentence that he has served, we were able to advise him that he would not pass the DBS check for the SIA for working in that industry. We were supportive to Vincent and he was grateful for us to prevent him from wasting his time, and we were then able to help him into a different construction industry course that he is interested in instead and liaised with his work coach to ensure that he could get enrolled as soon as possible.

Michael was released from prison recently and is a recovering addict but has come out clean and on a script. Michael realised himself that he needs to keep busy to eliminate temptations to try and stay out of prison so asked for some guidance with this. We have been able to refer him onto a service whose purpose is supporting ex- offenders to resettle successfully onto the local community and not reoffend. We recognised the importance of the need to work quickly with other supporting services together to ensure we were able to keep Michael motivated in engaging with these positive life changes.

As a Direction Coordinator, my role is to help people get their lives back on track and support them by finding the right agency to help them achieve the best outcome. I also work closely with HMP Bedford, attending their Discharge Board meetings and Departure lounge so early help can be offered to the people leaving prison. Another facet of my role within the wider YouTurn Futures organisation is to work alongside Luton Youth Offending Service and attend the MAGPan (Multi-Agency Gang Panel) to identify and support 17-year-olds who are at risk of exploitation by organised crime gangs. I do this by mentoring, identifying suitable ETE and helping them get away from offending behavior.

In my personal life I coach rugby, and against by bodies wishes play as much as I can (which I always pay for in the morning), being bullied by my 2 dogs is also a regular occurrence. As father I spend as much time as I can seeing my 2 sons and helping my youngest son lead his best possible life and cope with a life with Tourette's syndrome and raise awareness of the difficulties of living with this and ASD.
